





Teaching children can be immensely rewarding, anyone who has taught children can tell you that. But it's not fun and games all the time, and sometimes it's just not that easy. English teachers who wish to teach children must be aware of the challenges and difficulties they may encounter, and prepare accordingly.

- 1. Make some rules: Make the rules, which should be fair and consistent, clear from the first day of class.
- 2. Make a friendly environment: Remember the students' names the first time you meet them. Encourage all students to remember their classmates' names. Use their names often when teaching.
- 3. Let them experience it: Show your students what to do. Don't explain. Just do. Just be. They will follow your lead. English needs to be experienced, not explained.
- 4. Earn their trust: Nourish trust between you and the students with each class. Through your actions let them know that you will never embarrass them for making a mistake in English.
- 5. Make eye to eye contact: Use eye contact to communicate your praise and disappointment.
- 6. Be surprised: Always be pleasantly surprised when students interact with each other or you in English.
- 7. Let their personality grow: Show respect to the children (since they are worthy of it) and let them sometimes be the teacher. Use English as a tool to build their self-confidence and self-esteem.
- 8. Be Prepared: Preparation is of course the key for any teaching job, but this is particularly true of young children. Never make the mistake of showing up for class with little or no ideas, and thinking that you'll figure it out as you go along. Remember that a little preparation goes a long way!
- 9. Don't let them get bored: If children are bored they won't pay attention, and they won't learn. Your job is to make learning fun. This is one factor that really matters to kids. And that goes for kids on the playground as well as those in the classroom.
- 10. Enjoy it: Remember childhood through your students and enjoy!
